Whedbee - Robertsville Cemetery

Looking for information on Robertsville Cemetery.

My Grandfathers first wife, Lillie H. Giles Whedbee is buried at Robertsville Cemetery. I have not been able to find any records about Lillie (b May 1881 TN) or her parents, or Lillie and her husband John L Whedbee Sr. (b. 28 Jul 1867 TN) The only clue I have is from her son - a letter which he wrote about his life - in it he stated -

"She is buried in the Oakridge Tennessee Cemetery where no body known there was never a marker or tombstone planted at her head. As we left Tennessee when I was seven. There is a marker now I put it there. buried by aunt Cora Smith. Later I put a head stone to her grave by aunt Cora Smith."

The problem with that statement is that Lillie is surrounded by "Smith's in the immediate circle of headstones around her. There is no Cora Smith. Although there is no headstone to the left of her grave. IS THERE ANY WAY TO FIND OUT WHO IS BURRIED IN THE UNMARKED GRAVE TO THE LEFT OF LILLIE WHEDBEE?

In the list on the internet there is no Cora Smith in the Robertsville Cemetery, however it could easily be that the list on the internet is from Headstones only.

Another alternative for me is to figure out if any of the maiden names of the other people buried around Lillie was Giles. But if there are records to be had any there maybe there will be records for Lillie. Since she was only 23 when she died (of TB) her parents would surely have been known.
