We think she might have been born in May of 1898 based on my mother's memory of her birthday and how old she was when she died in the early 1970's. My mother's father was James Leroy Stokes. Elizabeth is said to have been from Anderson Co TN. Her family lived on a farm in Maynardville and most migrated to Knoxville in the 1950's.

Elizabeth's father's name was "Andy", which I assume is short for Andrew Humphry, but she cannot recall her grandmother's name because both were dead by the time she came along. Elizabeth had twelve children with James, they had two sets of identical twins, my mother being the youngest (now age 72) as well as one of the twins. I appreciate any help with this family. The US Post Office is getting real picky...if the address isn't absolutely correct, we may get their journals back as "Undeliverable as addressed...Return to Sender...Postage Due \$1.65." Then we get to send it out again, not at bulk rate, but as first class mail...\$1.82. If the recipient moves to another apartment in the same building, the journal is returned to us, because the address is incorrect.
