Arnett – Munday:

Sarah Ann Munday (Aug. 29, 1863-June 10, 1940) was from Knox County near Clinton according to her obituary and died in Campbell Co. She raised 12 children with my great grandfather Christian "Timothy" Arnett (1857-1914) but there is no official record of marriage since he abandoned his first wife in Carter Co, TN. They met in Knoxville around 1884-1886 and moved to Newcomb, TN in Campbell Co. to start a family. Sarah had one child (Mary) with another man before meeting Timothy. Sarah's father was Robert Munday (1839-1916) and mother Mary Munday (1847-?) and married Sep 12, 1862 in Knox Co., lived in District 8 of Knox Co. in 1880, and was a shoemaker. I really want to find out when Timothy came to Knoxville and how he met Sarah. A family story says that he came to Newcomb with another man and bought land together around 1885 so I wonder if that is Sarah's father. I know that they came to work the coal mines. I would also like to know if they were ever officially married after his first wife filed for divorce in 1895. Laura Arnett Smith, larnett@utk.edu


Frazier – Jellico:
