#### John Nowell/Noel in 1815

Looking to see if and when a TN grant of 10 acres to John Nowell/Noel in 1815 was sold? John Noel died in Anderson County in the 1820s and his widow Elizabeth was still there in 1830. She then married 2nd Reuben Casada in 1841 in Anderson County. They shortly thereafter moved to Henry County, Iowa. If I could find what happened to John Nowell/Noel's 10 acres (and perhaps he had more that I am not aware of), the transfer of the property to the next owner would be a document I very much need to help a lady with a DAR application. Also, would there be a guardianship record that has survived showing who was appointed guardian of John and Elizabeth Nowell/Noel's children after he died in Anderson County in the 1820s? #### **Christof Frey**

My great grandfather was Christof Frey from Baden, Germany. He was born 3 May 1861 in Scwabisch-Gmund and died 23 Nov. 1935 in Cincinnati. When he arrived in New York as an immigrant in 1881, he very soon headed to Black Oak Ridge, Tennessee. Sometime in 1882, he moved on to Ohio and settled in Cincinnati. He was a stone mason and in one of his letters to his family back in Germany, he remarked that the work in Tennessee had been too dangerous and 5 men had died. Does anyone know of stone mason work that would have been dangerous during that timeframe? Thanks for any assistance you can and your groups can provide.
