## **Queries:**

#### Poor/Stooksbury/Rutherford

Jane/Jennie Stooksbury married Peter Poor in Anderson County in 1857. Jane Stoksbury Poor's parents were Nancy Rutherford and Joseph/Josiah Stukesbury (a casualty of the Mexican War). Peter's parents were Christopher Poor and Sarah Snodderly. Peter and Jane Stooksbury Poor moved from Anderson County to Cedar County Missouri by way of Indiana about 1861. Don't understand all that moving during the Civil War. Seems like a bad time to travel. Several generations were born and died in the area of Anderson County Tennessee early in the history. I want to know these people, not just the names but who they were, what they did. In addition, I really hope to eventually identify which Nancy Rutherford, my ancestor Joseph/Josiah Stukesbury was married to. There are so many Nancy Rutherford's of about the same age. I wonder if perhaps the Nancy Rutherford I seek could even be a widow of a Rutherford and not a Rutherford at all. That would change the direction of that line! According to the marriage record I found, she could have been in her late 20's when they married and compared, most first marriages were earlier. Thank you for any help you can provide. Looking for information on Seborn Segraves; b. May1821 NC, d. 18 Sept. 1904 in Hickory Valley, Anderson. He married (1) Mary Freeman, (2) Causada Plummer – b. 1849 (m. 24 Aug. 1876 Ashe Co. NC) According to census records, he lived in the following locations;

1850 – Wilkes Co. NC,

1860 - Yancey Co. NC,

1870 – Sevier Co. TN,

1880 - Sullivan Co. TN
